#### Fall Weekend 2022


Fall Weekend 2022 was Horizon's first fall weekend returning inperson to Timber Pointe Outdoor Center (TPOC) since 2019!
Participants completed arts and crafts such as pumpkin decorating, played board games, barbequed, enjoyed campfires and trails, and took in the beautiful nature and changing fall colors of the TPOC grounds.

The total cost of Fall Weekend 2022 was \$6,354.

#### Virtual Spring Weekend 2023



What initially started as pandemic-era program, Horizon's Virtual Spring Weekend has become a staple programming opportunity, appealing to a broad base of participants because of its accessibility on Zoom.

In 2023, Horizon held its third virtual spring weekend, "March Madness," sending goodie boxes with supplies to participate in virtual activities. Over 68 participants joined, enjoying activities such as trivia, a "Chopped!" cooking competition, spa day, and late night hangouts. The total cost of Virtual Spring Weekend 2023 was \$1,423.

## **Programs**Summer Camp 2023

Horizon Summer Camp was held July 16-22, 2023. Its second year back as an in-person program saw continued growth in attendance, with 187 total attendees, including 88 participants, 90 volunteers, 3 nurses, and 6 members of the support team. The theme of the week was "Horizonpalooza" with daily themes of differest music festival genres including: Woodstock, Country Fest, Rock & Roll Fest, Lollapalooza, and Coachella. The week included a Horizonpalooza day, complete with a rocking lineup of 3 incredible bands, including indie, country/rock, and covers of 80's classics – creating Horizon's very own music festival experience!

The total cost of Summer Camp was \$143,473.

At Summer Camp 2023, participants tried new skills such as: adaptive bicycling, canoeing, ziplining, ropes course swinging, and riding in a hot air balloon! We took moments to relax in nature with arts and crafts, partnered yoga, and a spa day. Our participants and volunteers enjoyed featured activities such as a boat night, camp carnival, haunted trails, and a dance party! Horizon Camp is a home-away-fromhome where people of all abilities are welcome to socialize, laugh, play, learn, experience, and grow. Through our one-on-one pairings during this special week, Horizon breaks down barriers for people with and without physical disabilities in order to widen perspectives and build confidence and independence for all.

#### Horizon Hope Grant





Horizon continues to hold weekly Zoom calls as part of our yearround engagement via Camp Never Ends. Starting in the early days of the COVID-19 pandemic, these weekly calls have been crucial to keeping our community connected, attracting new participants, and fostering new friendships. In addition to building connections throughout the year, these weekly Zoom calls have empowered many in our community to grow and take on new leadership roles within our organization.

#### Seasonal Newsletter

Every season, Horizon sends our community an e-newsletter to recap programs that have been held and promote upcoming Horizon events and fundraisers. Each issue also features a highlight about a member of our community and reaches over 2,500 recipients. In addition to engaging our community with the newsletter, a committee comprised of Horizonites, both new and old, collaborates to write and design each issue.

## Pizza Coupons & Holiday Card

Starting in 2022, Horizon began selling coupons for Lou Malnati's frozen personal pizzas. In its second sale in February 2023, Horizon more than doubled its sales from July 2022, selling 231 coupons and raising \$1,155 for camp.

During the holiday season, Horizon sends a card thanking our dedicated community members and sponsors for their continued support. This year, our supporters generously gave back \$6,885 in the holiday spirit!

#### Annual Raffle 2023

This past year, Horizon sold 5,235 raffle tickets and awarded \$5,000 in prizes to winners! These sales brought in a profit of over \$20,000 for camp 2023!

Horizon continued to offer both online and physical raffle ticket sales and encouraged sellers by offering incentives such as a "cut-the-line" pass for any camp activity in addition to doing personal check-ins with pledged ticket sellers. This year, the Board would like to recognize our reigning top ticket seller, Scott Galvin and our cut-the-line winner Lily Ferber!

This past June, Horizon held its Mini-Golf for Good summer event! At the event, friends, family, and members of Horizon spent the day visiting and playing mini-golf at a fully wheelchair accessible mini-golf course. Attendees also enjoyed a summer barbeque lunch, and game such as golf scratchers that were sold in-person and online after the event. Overall, 34 individuals came out for the event. Between ticket sales, sponsorships, and scratcher earnings, this event raised \$2,702for Horizon.

## Small & Member-led Fundraising



## Financial Report 2021-2022

### Revenue Summary

As seen in the chart to the right, Horizon's revenue this past year primarily came from Donations (44%), such as donations for Summer Camp, Memorial Gifts, or from the Holiday Card.

Fundraisers accounted for another 36% of the revenue Horizon earned in the last year. The Board is looking forward to expanding our fundraising efforts further with our return to in-person gatherings and continuing to seek out new grant and donor opportunities.

## **Review: Annual Goals**

The Board of Directors had the following goals for 2022-23:

- **1. Raise \$150,000.** As of July 31, 2023, we raised a total of \$148,035.
- **2. Sell all 5,000 annual raffle tickets.** We sold 5,235 raffle tickets, the most ever!
- 3. Ensure that communication focuses on telling our story, connecting with our audience, increasing photos on the website, and removing old content. Several pages on our website have been updated with recent and more photos, specifically the recruitment focused pages. Old or repeat graphics are removed or archived on our Facebook and Instagram after they have been up a while so that photos of our programming stick out to new visitors to these pages. This done periodically, but could be done more proactively.
- 4. Weave diversity, equity, and inclusion principles into every aspect of our work. Consider who is involved in decision making. The Board has pursued equity in its program offerings, particularly with virtual programs and events. Representation of people with disabilities in Horizon leadership has also improved; the Board welcomed four new members this year, 3 of whom have attended camp as participants. Horizon continues to look for ways to improve our understanding and efforts around DE&I principles.
- 5. Increase Board participation with committees, mentoring and sharing work, and being proactive about ways to contribute. This year, Horizon Board Members were required to sit on one programmatic committee and one financial committee, differing from past requirements, in order to increase Board Member involvement in the financial development of our organization.
- 6. Evaluate our needs as an organization, what areas would most benefit from outside help and what tasks the Board can take on. The Board held a special meeting in March 2023 to assess our needs and priorities.
